New partnership: Cat Advocates of Troy

You may of heard.....Cat Advocates of Troy (CAT) is now in partnership with DREAM pet rescue. The primary mission of CAT is to STOP and REDUCE the overpopulation of STRAY and FERAL felines, in our county, by utilizing a TNR (Trap -Neuter and RETURN) program. This ALL VOLUNTEER organization has been busy in our Miami County with Trapping, Transporting to a vet for Neuter/Spay, Managing Recovery and then Release/Returning these

stray/feral felines to their colony. As of June 2018, CAT has spayed, neutered and vaccinated 232. The population of stray and feral felines in our community will EXPAND AGAIN in the SPRING (when many kittens are born) and more volunteers are definitely needed to help with trapping and transporting to the vet for spay/ neuter and vaccines. Special note: IF anyone feeds community cats please make sure they are fixed ASAP, because IF they are two months old and weigh two pounds they can become pregnant at four months old. Rehoming personal dogs

We often receive requests from owners to help rehome a personal dog for a variety of reasons. While our rescue focus and mission is and has always been to save the life of a shelter dog, rehabilitate and rehome, we do offer assistance when the owner can meet the following requirements:

- 1) He/she must provide continued quality care for the dog until he/she is adopted along with pictures
- 2) Vet records must be current and dog must be spayed or neutered, and
- 3) A rehoming form regarding the dog being surrendered is required, along with a donation to DREAM for our time and effort, and 4) An owner surrender form is required as well. The Re-homing page of our website (Dream4pets.org) provides details forms for rehoming a personal dog, and ADOPTAPET.com has great information as well. Rehoming is never a quick or easy process... consideration is given to the breed, age, health, vet records, socialization level, and energy it can take anywhere from 6 weeks to 6 months, or longer. Our foster homes (never enough) when available are primarily for dogs we rescue from county shelters.
